Getting Started

Key Ideas for Discussion

Takeaway Truth: John points us to Jesus through whom our deepest reproach is taken away and our dignity is restored.

Digging Deeper (Read the sermon text again and discuss the following questions.)

- Why were Zechariah and Elizabeth considered righteous and upright?
- Why was childlessness such an impactful situation?
- Read Dan. 8:15-27. What similarities/differences do you see between Daniel’s/Zechariah’s interaction with Gabriel? What can we glean about angels from these passages?
- Why was this such a special day for Zechariah? What do you believe Zechariah was praying for when Gabriel appeared?
- What would John do with his life and why was this significant?
- How did Elizabeth receive the news? How was this different than Zechariah?
- How did God demonstrate in the lives of these two that He is still sovereign?

Apply It!

- ❖ When have you doubted the reality of God’s provision for you? Is this a temptation you commonly face? If so, how do you respond to it?
- ❖ On a scale of 1-10 (w/1 being low), how would you rate your expectation that God could do something amazing through your life?
- ❖ What long-term frustration can you identify in your life that needs to be entrusted to God?

Think About It!
