Getting Started

- ❖ When we are confronted with a call to repent, why do we tend to either strongly accept or reject the invitation?

Key Ideas for Discussion

1. The Messenger of Repentance (v.1-6, 19-20)
2. The Meaning of Repentance (v.3)
3. The Marks of Repentance (v.3, 7-14)
4. The Magnitude of Repentance (v.15-18)

Takeaway Truth: At the heart of the gospel is heartfelt repentance.

Digging Deeper (Read the sermon text again and discuss the following questions.)

- What is repentance? What's the difference between repentance and remorse? (Matt. 12:41; Jonah 3:8, Is. 55:7)
- How do repentance and faith work together for salvation? Acts 2:38
- How is the outward fruit John encouraged any different from the religious works of the Pharisees whom he condemned? (Gal. 5:22-23; Col. 1:10)
- What is the baptism in fire? (Is. 4:4; Jer. 23:29; Acts 2:3; 2 Tim. 1:6,). What does fire do that the Holy Spirit also does? (1 Cor 3:13; Mal. 3:2, 3; Ezek. 24:9-11). What is intended in the comparison of baptism with water versus fire?
- How can we bear fruit? (John 15:5,16)

Apply It!

- ❖ Jack Miller used to say, "We need to repent of our repentance." What do you think he meant, and do you agree?
- ❖ In what areas of your life do you need to show the fruits of repentance this week?
- ❖ John applied the principle that while God is at work changing people, He often does not change their work or their place in life. At work or play this week, what action can you take because of agreement with God's priorities?

With my arms stretched wide, I will worship you.


Come on my soul, oh don't you get shy on me.
