Getting Started

The "*Kingdom Concept*" that Ben mentioned at the beginning of the sermon is the simple, clear, "big idea" that defines how your church will glorify God and make disciples.

At Covenant Church we believe our kingdom concept is "Gospel Restoration." The "Kingdom Concept" is also the intersection of 3 key spheres: Local Predicament, Collective Potential, and Apostolic Espirit.

- What do you see as some of the unique resources and capabilities God has brought together in our church? (Collective Potential)
- What do you see that particularly focuses and energizes our leadership at Covenant Church? (Apostolic Espirit)

Digging Deeper

"'I know your works. You have the reputation of being alive, but you are dead.² Wake up, and strengthen what remains and is about to die, for I have not found your works complete in the sight of my God. ³ Remember, then, what you received and heard. Keep it, and repent. If you will not wake up, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what hour I will come against you." *Revelation 3:1b-3*

• Where do you believe you personally, your family, your small group, and your church might be in danger of "falling asleep"?

"Perseverance of the saints" is a critical doctrine of grace from the Bible. It teaches us that those who are saved, that is the elect, cannot lose their salvation.

• How does that reality shape and guide the way that approach obedience, good works, and repentance?

<u>Think about it</u>

"Virtually all of the great evangelistic challenges of the New Testament are basically calls to plant churches, not simply to share the faith. The Great Commission (Matt. 28:18–20) is a call not just to "make disciples" but to baptize. In Acts and elsewhere, it is clear that baptism means incorporation into a worshiping community with accountability and boundaries (cf. Acts 2:41– 47). The only way to be truly sure you are increasing the number of Christians in a town is to increase the number of churches." – Tim Keller, Why Plant Churches, 2002.
