Takeaway Truth – Jesus' sacrifice has radically changed our relationship with God, and it should radically change our relationship with each other.

Jesus' sacrifice has accomplished for us

- 1) Radical access to God
- 2) A secure hope
- 3) A new family of God with new privileges and responsibilities

Radical Access to God

- Reread Hebrews 10:19-22.
- What does it look like to enter God's presence confidently?
- Do we have this confidence and full assurance of faith when we draw near to God? Discuss why or why not. What are some reasons why we aren't confident?

A Secure Hope

- Reread Hebrews 10:23
- Do you have a secure hope, or do you often just find yourself hoping?
- What things do we tend to place our hope in other than God?
- What biblical truths can we use to combat false hope? (Examples hope and security in money, good circumstances, health, our abilities)

A New Family of God with New Privileges and Responsibilities

- Reread Hebrews 10:24-25
- What reasons and excuses do we often give for avoiding biblical community? (Why is it hard for us?)
- Discuss the need for stirring one another up to love and good works. Do we really need it? How can we be more regular in doing this?
- How can we better "encourage one another ... as we see the Day drawing near?"
- Read Acts 2:42-47. Discuss the pattern and example of the early church. What can we learn from them?

O how sweet the name that calms our storms; How tenderly his love transforms the hardest heart and the deepest shame. There is power, power in that wonderful name.


