Getting Started

- ❖ At the beginning of the message, Jerry testified that he had hesitated for years preaching from beginning to end in Romans due to not "measuring up" to its message.
 - What area(s) of your life do you tend to evaluate as not "measuring up"?
 - o How does the gospel free us from the need to "measure up"?
 - Take a few minutes and pray for one another to rest in the assurance the gospel gives us that Jesus "measures up" in our place. Pray specifically that God would give you the grace needed to be freed from a performance mentality.

Digging Deeper

- * Reread the Sermon Text and discuss the following:
 - What is missing in the gospel you believe in if you forget or downplay the truth that God's Son is "<u>Jesus</u>" or "<u>Christ</u>" or "<u>Lord</u>"? Do you ever downplay one or another of these names/titles in how you think and live?
 - What does this passage reveal about the promise of the "good news" and the person of the "good news"?
 - Jerry explained what the "obedience of faith" is and is not. Discuss what the "obedience of faith" is and how some have misunderstood it. Where do you see the "obedience of faith" in your own life?
 - Paul makes a point of stressing encouragement--- wanting to be encouraged by and to encourage the Romans when he visited them. What difference would it make if you went to church next Sunday consciously seeking to encourage others? What are some ways you could do this? Do you allow the faith and words of others to encourage you?
- ❖ Read Philippians 3:1-7. What about Paul's life before Christ would have caused him to see the message of Christ as "good news"?

The gospel is an announcement or declaration of something done and accomplished, not advice to follow.
