 Strained? Marked by assurance? Filled with doubt? Other?
 - Take some time this week to have at least 2 of your group members share their testimony of salvation, coming to know Christ in the gospel.

Digging Deeper

❖ Read Romans 1:8-15.

- Brainstorm together and list what these verses say about Paul's prayer life, his motivations, and his commitment to a body of believers he had never even met.
- o What stands out the most to you?
- Do these things point toward any changes you would like to make in these areas of your life?

Reread the Sermon Text and discuss the following:

- Since the gospel is for everyone, why do you think Paul says that it is "for the Jew first"? Observe Paul's evangelistic practice and comments in Acts 13:5, 14, 42-52 before you answer this question.
- Why does Paul let his readers know that he's not ashamed of the gospel? Was he saying it to allay any thoughts they had about him, or was he seeking to stimulate boldness in their presentation of and commitment to the gospel? Support your answer from the review of Romans you've already done.
- Why would Paul say he is "obligated" in verse 14? Read 1 Cor. 9:16-23 before answering.
- o In what way(s) is the gospel the "power of God"?
- Jerry explained that the "righteousness of God" in verse 17 has been a muchdebated phrase. How are we to understand it in verse 17 and why is this important?

Think About It!

Today, when most Christians talk about salvation and the gospel, they mean the *initial* act of placing trust in Jesus as their Savior from sin and as Lord of their life. Is this all Paul had in mind? Why or why not?
