Romans 2:1-16 – God's Just Judgement

♦ Getting the discussion started

In the sermon, the cost of a bottle of wine was used as an example to show we all judge by different standards. What are other areas are we prone to judge and be critical of other people?

In the sermon, the implicit standards of judgement we use for the cost of the bottle of wine were unwise use of resources and excessive behavior. With these other areas (question above), what implicit standards are we using? Do we violate our own standards? If so, how?

♦ Read Romans 14:1-12.

What is the tendency of the more mature brother in the faith? What is the tendency of the weaker brother in the faith?

What are the solutions to judging given in the passage?

- ♦ How can we interpret John 5:24 in light of the many scriptures that support the judgement of all people (including believers)?
- ♦ Discuss: What reasons do people give for universal moral standards? Why does the moral sense of mankind demand a future judgment?
- ♦ How might we live differently knowing that we are all accountable to God? [Suggestion: In your prayer time, in addition to your regular prayers, encourage each person to identify one area they want to grow in and have them pray that request (no need to discuss or talk about it)]
- ♦ In light of the certainty of judgement and knowing that God is patient and forbearing, pray for your 3-2-1 people and determine your next specific and tangible step you will take.
