The Faith Advantage Part 3: Acceptance Romans 8:14-17

Getting Started

- * Randy Pope opened up with a great illustration of acceptance from his elementary school years. Growing up what was your sense of acceptance? Were there special circumstances that aided or hindered your sense of acceptance?
- ❖ Briefly summarize what the average person thinks of when he or she hears the phrase "Holy Spirit."
- ❖ Opening Prayer Time: We had the pleasure of singing a song and being led in worship by one of our young adults who has grown up in our church. Let's open with prayer asking God to work through all the volunteers and staff who work with our young children and teenagers as they pour into the next generation of Kingdom leaders.

Digging Deeper

- * Reread and discuss Romans 8:14-17 in the ESV.
 - o "Sonship/Daughtership" (8:14) is seen in our adoption, inheritance, and suffering.
 - How does seeing yourself as adopted by God affect how you respond to: rejection, or acceptance; failure, or success; feeling out of control, or feeling in control?
 - How does recognizing your inheritance in God change your view of: money and wealth? relationships? the many or few opportunities you have in life?
 - What do verses 14-17 tell us about what the Holy Spirit does for us and through us?
 - What do these verses tell us about the closeness of our relationship to God as a consequence of the Spirit's work?
 - What does it mean to be "led by the Spirit"? Randy gave us many synonyms from other passages. How does the Spirit lead us? And how can we be sure that the guidance we sense is from the Spirit and not from our own desires? Think about the times you have sensed the Spirit's guiding hand. Were you right? Was the Spirit doing the directing? How did you know? Discuss what it means to be led by the Spirit.
 - As sons of God, we are "heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ" (v. 17). Although Paul will tell us later more about what we will inherit, in verse 17 he gives us a hint. What is that hint?
 - Although our inheritance appears to be conditional on whether we suffer with Christ, that's not what the word if means in verse 17. The idea may be better expressed as "Since we suffer" rather than "if."
 - Does the idea of our suffering with Jesus fit with what Scripture says elsewhere about what His disciples will experience?
 - Here are a few passages you might want to consult: Matthew 5:11, 12; Mark 8:34-38; John 15:18-21; 16:33; Acts 14:21, 22; 1 Peter 3:13-17; 4:12-19.

Applying this sermon to Our Lives

- Earlier you were asked a question about being "led by the Spirit". Many times we
 focus on "specific guidance for a specific situation", but the biblical idea is more of
 a "whole life of dependence on the Spirit".
 - How does this definition affect the way you seek to be led by the Spirit?
 - What needs to change in your life so that your whole life is depending on the Spirit?

Think About It!

The Spirit-filled life does not come through mystical or ecstatic experiences but from studying and submitting oneself to Scripture. As a believer faithfully and submissively saturates his mind and heart with God's truth, his Spirit-controlled behavior will follow as surely as night follows day. When we are filled with God's truth and led by His Spirit, even our involuntary reactions— those that happen when we don't have time to consciously decide what to do or say—will be godly. (John MacArthur)
