    - Its wealth
  - From verses 15-17, answer these questions about the Lord God's plans for man in the garden of Eden:
    - What were the man's tasks in the garden?
    - What might those roles have involved in a perfect environment?
    - Whom might the man have needed to guard against? (see also Gen. 3:1)
    - What was the positive command of the Lord God to the man about the garden?
    - What was the Lord God's prohibition to the man about the garden?
    - What were the promised consequences of disobeying this prohibition?
  - How did the Lord God reveal to Adam that in all of creation there was no "helper comparable to him"?
  - What does Adam's ability to name all the animals reveal about him?
  - Although Adam provided the materials from which the woman was made, he was completely passive during her creation. Why do you think God wanted it that way?
  - In Genesis 2:24, what implications for marriage are contained in each of these clauses?
    - "A man shall leave his father and mother"
    - "A man shall ... be joined to his wife"
    - "They shall become one flesh"
