Takeaway Truth: Jesus never shuns humble and repentant sinners.

- ❖ Based on what you read in Luke's passage, how would you describe Simon? The woman?

- Why would the crowd be shocked by Jesus' statement to the woman about her sins?

- With which character in the story do you most identify?
- Which of the woman's actions do you find most compelling?
- How would you describe Jesus' compassion? What limits, if any, do you see?
- If you were the woman in this story, how would the words and touch of Jesus make you feel?

## Apply It

- In what ways are we like Simon the Pharisee in terms of how we view others?
- ❖ Is your love for the Lord more like the sinful woman's or Simons? Why?
